Think jaw-dropping views in the Flinders Ranges, leisurely ocean drives along the Limestone Coast, lazing along the banks of the Murray River, sipping world-famous wine in the Barossa or chilling in culture-rich Adelaide. For those who want a little more from their getaways, exploring these six unique road trips across South Australia is the perfect way to reward your curiosity, all you need is a sense of wonder. The Epicurean Way seamlessly links together the four iconic wine regions of McLaren Vale, Adelaide Hills, Barossa and Clare Valley in a journey not available anywhere else in Australia. World-famous food, a superb array of wines and spectacular scenery all come together on this road trip.



Follow the Coastal Way road trip through our seaside playground: the Yorke Peninsula. Cruise along more than 700 kilometres of pristine coast, spending your days surfing, swimming, fishing and exploring. Stop-off at stunning coastal towns for fresh seafood, fine wine and sumptuous local produce, then spend the night, cosied-up in a wide range of accommodation, or camp under the stars for a true sea escape.



Discover the Mighty Murray Way and follow the laid-back rhythm of one of the world's longest rivers. Through its ever-changing landscapes, uncover the lifeblood of industry, nature and lifestyle that is the Murray River, while indulging in the unique array of experiences from rich Aboriginal culture to microbreweries and gourmet produce, riverboats and cruises. It's all here on the banks of the river waiting to be explored.



Discover the ultimate seafood safari on the Eyre Peninsula, as you wine and dine in Port Lincoln, shuck oysters in Coffin Bay and find the state's best fishing in Cowell. Follow the stunning coastline to encounter wildlife in its natural environment and swim with sea lions, witness great white sharks with a truly unique South Australian cage diving experience, and spend an afternoon up close and personal with giant cuttlefish. Continue on the Nullarbor to discover the magenta waters of Lake MacDonnell, before the epic journey all the way through to Perth.



Stunning cliff faces, roaring waves and spectacular beaches are just some of the highlights of this road trip. Not to mention the Coonawarra wine region, the Naracoorte Caves and Victor Harbor. Four-wheel drive along pristine beaches or kayak along the still waterways of the Coorong and explore Kangaroo Island. Continue on to the Great Ocean Road and through to Melbourne.

### 1 WILLUNGA FARMERS MARKET

Saturday's mornings in McLaren Vale are worth an early wake up call. Browse and buy delicious, fresh, local and seasonal produce in the Willunga Town Square. With over 80 vendors, this farmer's market is open every Saturday from 8am-12.3opm.

### 2 HITHER & YON

Located in the heart of Willunga's main street, Hither & Yon's cellar door sits inside an 1860's butcher shop that still retains some of the old features. This family run label celebrates the rolling and easy-going nature of McLaren Vale so sit back, relax and enjoy a glass or two after grazing at the Willunga Farmers Market.

#### 3 WIRRA WIRRA VINEYARDS

Go behind the scenes with a tour of the winery and its historic ironstone cellars before hitting the cellar door for a sip of the goods. Hungry? Pop next door to Harry's Deli for a bite of regional produce.

### 4 RED POLES CAFÉ & RESTAURANT

Offering the perfect mix of food, wine, Aboriginal art and ale, this exciting space is situated in the middle of a vineyard and surrounded by lush gardens and natural bushland.

#### 5 CHALK HILL

Chalk Hill - a must visit McLaren Vale hub showcasing Never Never Distilling Co., Chalk Hill Wines and Cucina di Strada (by Pizzateca - pizza that will make you weak at the knees) with arguably the best views in the wine region.

### 6 D'ARENBERG ?

d'Arenberg's Cube offers an incredible and unique multisensory journey inside the Rubik's cube-shaped five-storey building that will leave a lasting impression. Soak up the d'Arenberg Cube experience over the seasonal menu at d'Arry's Verandah Restaurant, soak up the atmosphere in the 360degree video room or get creative and blend your own wine in an extraordinary experience.

### 7 LONGVIEW VINEYARD

Experience why these Adelaide Hills award-winning cool-climate wines tastes even better alongside a seasonal, locally-sourced tapas menu. While you're here, why not stay the night? You can fall asleep below the brightest stars and wake up surrounded by the most spectacular country landscapes.

### 8 HAHNDORF VILLAGE PRECINCT

### HAHNDORFSA.ORG.AU

Start at Prancing Pony to sample some fine brews, just a short drive away is Beerenberg Strawberry Farm, the place to stock up on jams, marinades and preserves and pick fresh strawberries from November to April. Hahndorf Main Street boasts producers, cellar doors, cafes and restaurants, some with a nod to German heritage and others representing local and international fare. Learn to make cheese at Udder Delights, blend

your own botanicals at Ambleside Distillers or for a truly premium experience, spend the day under the trees on a VIP Day Bed at Sidewood Cellar Door and Restaurant.

#### 9 LOT.100

Located in Hay Valley in the Adelaide Hills LOT.100 has been put together by a collaborative effort of The Hills Cider Company, Ashton Valley Fresh, Mismatch Brewing Co, Adelaide Hills Distillery & Vinteloper. Together they cover the best of South Australian craft beverages and paired with incredible lunch options, this expansive property has something for everyone.

### 10 WOODSIDE CHEESE WRIGHTS

Woodside is true to the word 'artisan', where all the cheeses are crafted by hand. Drop by to appreciate the taste and art of handcrafted cheese or visit Melba Chocolates, just next door.

### II URAIDLA

#### VISITADELAIDEHILLS.COM.AU

Uraidla is a perfect spot for a casual meal no matter the weather. In the Hills township you'll find an 18th-century heritage church artistically baptised into a pizza venue, creatively named Lost in a Forest. Across the road is a quirky and cosy brewery/pub/café and a bakery which is full of charm, food options worth travelling for every day of the week and plenty of garden space for the kids to run around in.

#### 12 PENFOLDS MAGILL ESTATE?

The brand that put Australian wine on the map. Stunning views, the iconic Bin range and restaurants offering the most exquisite contemporary fare and exemplary service makes Magill Estate a must. The café attached also allows for a more cost-effective daytime culinary experience.

### NATIONAL WINE CENTRE OF AUSTRALIA

When's the last time you had over 120 wines available at the click of a button in the Adelaide CBD (or anywhere for that matter)? Educate yourself on the process, history and ethos of winemaking in Australia—and then why not spend a while sampling the results?

### APPLEWOOD DISTILLERY & UNICO ZELO

Experience craft gin, liquors and spirits featuring local botanicals and fruit. Prefer wine? Sip your way through a flight of curious wines that uniquely represent Australian wine at Unico Zelo.

#### 15 MAGGIE BEER'S FARM SHOP

A sampler's delight! Pâté, chutney, verjuice and salted caramel, to name just a few. You can enjoy a cappuccino or some informal lunch out on the deck overlooking the local pond. If you're looking for a more substantial meal, head over to the adjoining Farm Eatery, where you can learn the tricks of the trade through a cooking class, gin-making experience or an impressive country-style long lunch.

### 16 SEPPELTSFIELD?

Taste Tawny from your Birth Year or the legendary 100-year old fortified. Be sure to also visit the JamFactory gallery and working studios, and dine at Fino restaurant. Are you a fan of Aussie natural skincare products? Do your body a favour and stop into Vasse Virgin or take part in their delightful workshops before you leave.

### 17 HENTLEY FARM

Globally acclaimed for its excellence in culinary service, Hentley Farm is a single estate boutique winery nestled amongst rolling hills in the west of the Barossa Valley, producing exceptional wines and memorable experiences. In keeping with the local theme, it's always a plus to be eating out of an 1880's stable converted into a contemporary modern restaurant!

### 18 GREENOCK

#### BAROSSA.COM

Barossa's best kept secret! This township may be small but it packs a lot of charm with food and drink options within walking distance from each other. You'll find Greenock Brewers a boutique beer brewery, El Estanco will provide the best pastry's in the area and the Murray Street Vineyards and Kalleske Wines both have a cellar door on site.

#### 19 WATERVALE HOTEL

Set against the backdrop of the stunning hills of Watervale browse the extensive wine list which highlights the variety of grape grown and produced through the Clare Valley region and the Tasting Plate menu encompasses sharing style of street food, using local, fresh and seasonal produce with an added flair.

### SEVENHILL CELLARS & ST ALOYSIUS CHURCH

Take a guided walking tour of this very spiritual site in the heart of Clare Valley. The first winery of the region and established by the Society of Jesuits in 1851, it's certainly worth the visit. Enjoy the underground cellar, wine museum, Roman Catholic Church and the best sacramental wine on the market. The Riesling Trail also travels through the vineyards of this historic site and is a great way to experience this region.

### 21 PIKES WINES

Few wines are as synonymous with Australian Riesling as Pikes. But did you know the Pikes brand is also responsible for one of South Australia's oldest craft breweries. Taste it all, and more, at the recently established SLATE Restaurant onsite.

### 1 WALK THE YORKE

The best way to discover Yorke Peninsula's pristine coastline is along this scenic, continuous 500km walking/cycling trail from Port Wakefield to Moonta Bay. Hop on and off the trail to explore further as you make your way around the region.

### **ARDROSSAN**

### ARDROSSAN VISITOR INFORMATION CENTRE YORKEPENINSULA.COM.AU

The Ardrossan Lookout provides a phenomenal birdseye view of the town, the coast and the extensive impact the dolomite quarry and silos have had on the region. Drop anchor at the Ardrossan Heritage Museum, which casts insight into the region's maritime chronicles (shipwrecks included!) or visit Emoyeni Wines a boutique family run winery that is family friendly too.

### 3 PORT VINCENT

#### YORKEPENINSULA.COM.AU

Like most of the towns on the Yorke Peninsula, Port Vincent is an old port. It was once one of the old landing spots for the ketches going up and down the peninsula, but these days its a well known holiday playground and it's an ideal location for fishing, crabbing, boating, sailing, swimming and snorkelling.

### **4** STANSBURY OYSTERS

#### SOUTHERN YORKE OYSTER SHED SALES - 0407 189 121

Apart from being an attractive coastal spot for camping and fishing, Stansbury is the stronghold for an impressive supply of fresh oysters hauled straight off the coast. Get your hands dirty being a 'Deckie for a Day' on the Pacific Estate Oysters boat or preorder your freshly shucked oysters from one of the two local operators.

### 5 EDITHBURGH

#### ORKEPENINSULA.COM.A

Situated on top of cliffs overlooking Troubridge Island, Edithburgh hosts great swimming beaches and a tidal swimming pool with a shallow area for kids. The towns jetty is renowned for its spectacular diving and ease for all levels of experience. You can expect to see a variety of marine life, including big-bellied seahorses, Port Jackson sharks, leafy sea dragons and cuttlefish.

# 6 TROUBRIDGE ISLAND ESCAPE & CHARTER TROUBRIDGEISLANDESCAPE.SQUARESPACE.COM

Want to have a secluded island all to yourself? Book your unique escape with Troubridge Island Escape. Located next to the only pre-fabricated cast iron lighthouse in South Australia built in 1856 (now retired). Share your island holiday with the little penguins colony, migratory shore birds, playful dolphins & Sammy the resident sea lion.

### 7 WAROOKA

#### RKEPENINSULA.COM.AU

On Yorkes you are never far from great beaches and Warooka is no exception, with Flaherty's Beach and Hardwicke Bay a short drive away. Whilst here make sure to check out local gallery Baker Bros. Top Shop Gallery or check Ballara's Art and Lifestyle Retreat events calendar. Feeling peckish? Cafe Moorooboo is your place to go for a quick bite.

### 8 MARION BAY

Sitting on the doorstep of Dhilba Guuranda - Innes National Park, Marion Bay is an idyllic coastal town popular for swimming and surfing. The town is also a popular fishing destination, get a guide to point you in the right direction with the likes of Reef Encounters Fishing Charters. After a day spent beachside, quieten your rumbling stomach at the Marion Bay Tavern where you'll find local seafood staples and wood oven pizzas. Be sure to also check out the boutique Studio Surf Art Gallery and Café, featuring coastal inspired artwork by local artists, you may even find one to take home.

### DHILBA GUURANDA -INNES NATIONAL PARK

A must-do on your Yorke Peninsula itinerary. Get amongst this awe-inspiring national park that delivers striking seascapes overlooking Ethel Wreck and Pondalowie Bay. Adventure awaits with a brilliant blend of wildlife, bushwalking, camping and surfing. Jump onboard a Marion Bay Ocean Safari and see the stunning Innes coastline from a different perspective whilst spotting dolphins and wildlife.

### 10 MINLATON

#### ORKEPENINSULA.COM.AU

Pull up a stool at local gem Watsacowie Brewing Company and enjoy a pint or two. At the edge of town, you can also discover the Harry Butler Red Devil Monoplane and the story behind Captain Butler's love affair with flying.

#### 11 BARLEY STACKS WINES FYSTACKSWINES COM - (08) 8834 125

The grapes at this sustainably-minded winery are grown, crushed, fermented and bottled on-site, making it a must-see cellar door for any wine lover. Pair your favourite drop with a house made pizza or regional platter.

### 12 SUNNY HILL DISTILLERY

Yorke Peninsula's first crop to drop micro-distillery is situated just north of Arthurton atop one of the highest points of the peninsula. Come and enjoy a craft spirit made entirely on-site, whilst taking in the luxurious tasting room and enjoying the incredible views stretching all the way west to Spencer Gulf.

### 13 PORT HUGHES

#### ORKEPENINSULA.COM.AU

With its clear blue waters and iconic long jetty, Port Hughes is widely renowned as a fishing hot spot. The Tavern, General Store, CopperClub and Love The Grind are all excellent choices for a feed. The Dunes golf course is the jewel crown of the township, designed by Greg Norman. Tee up and play 18 or 9 holes.

### 14 MOONTA & MOONTA BAY

#### YORKEPENINSULA.COM.AU

If the fantastic view of the bay wasn't enough for you, then the Coffee Barn Gelateria, The Cornish Kitchen, Taste the Yorke, Splash Town water park and the iconic Moonta Mines Tourist Railway and Sweets Shop are just some of the places that make this historical part of the peninsula so much fun.

## COPPER COAST VISITOR INFORMATION CENTRE

The visitor information centre is the gateway to The Farm Shed Museum, a National Trust Museum and the very popular Copper Coast Putt-Putt and the Copper Coast Indoor Play Centre. Prepare for the kids to never want to leave!

### 16 WALLAROO

One of the most popular coastal escapes on the Yorke Peninsula is also the perfect family destination. The township boasts an impressive amount of things to see and do including a visit to the North Beach where you can book yourself a lesson with Stoked Kitesurfing or for something more relaxing enjoy a coffee at the North Beach Kitchen. Keen fisher? Fishing fanatics flock to Wallaroo to cast a line off the famous jetty; expect good hauls of snapper, King George whiting, squid and flathead. For the little one's book a Little Farmer Tour at Tarnasey Farm, an experience they'll remember forever. For a good coffee, meal and drink book yourself a table at The Smelter or Bond Store Wallaroo which is a microbrewery, distillery and restaurant all under the same roof.



An enchanting scene overlooking the glorious Murray River. Filled with down-to-earth charm and a homespun atmosphere, this rustic riverfront brewery is the perfect place to knock the top off a cold one at the end of a long river run. Pull up in your kayak or houseboat and head straight to the bar!

### MURRAY RIVER TRAILS (GREAT WALKS OF AUSTRALIA)

Discover the magic of this amazing river landscape and learn the stories you can't read about in books. Book your unique river tour catering for a range of interests including nature, wildlife, food, wine and soft adventure. All tours depart from Renmark and are available from March to November.

### 3 RENMARK

Fancy a tasting of locally made gin or brandy? Clock in at the impressive Twenty Third Street Distillery for a range of experiences to open your senses to new dimensions and flavours. Or in the theme of good spirits, head to Angove, home of St Agnes Brandy, and swill some organic local wines from the region's oldest winery. Pep up with a cup of freshly roasted coffee at Arrosto Coffee or head over to the Renmark Club for fresh and locally sourced produce and stunning views of the River Murray.

#### 4 RIVERLAND WINE CENTRE

Hosting over 25 different Riverland wineries, the Wine Centre's interactive storyboards take you through the journey of each winery and help whet your appetite for the delicious wine and produce this region has to offer.

#### 5 CANOE ADVENTURES

Explore the wonders of nature along the banks of the river, in the golden light of sunrise or sunset on a guided kayak tour. Whether you are an experienced kayaker or a first time paddler, this adventure is a must whilst in the Riverland.

### SALENA ESTATE WINES / CUCINA 837 AT SALENA

Salena Estate are known for the large selection of wine in their repertoire, the hardest thing will be trying to decide what to have. Along side the cellar door, you'll find Italian restaurant Cucina 837 at Salena, showcasing the family's Italian heritage through food and wine. Serving up freshly made pasta and wood oven pizzas alongside traditional antipasto platters designed to share.

### 7 THE VILLAGE

#### THEVILLAGELOXTON.COM.AU

Step back into yesteryear with sheep shearing demonstrations, tractor parades, and live demonstrations at the bakery and blacksmith shop before heading to the Loxton Pioneer Playground for more hours of fun for the whole family.

### 8 919 WINES CELLAR DOOR

Tucked away off the main drag, sit down to some environmentally conscious and vegan-friendly wines. With the flight including Touriga, Sangiovese and Durif, '919' brings to the table a unique Mediterranean series of wines less common to this region.

### 9 LAKE BONNEY

### BARMERA VISITOR INFORMATION CENTRE 8588 2289 RIVERTIME.COM.AU

A stone's throw from Barmera, this freshwater lake is the ideal spot to cool off. It's also a water sports lover's dream: swimming, windsurfing, kitesurfing and water skiing await.

### BANROCK STATION WINE & WETLAND CENTRE

Located within an internationally recognised wetland complex and supported by a globally significant wetland centre, this region's iconic brand offers fine dining and exceptional wine topped off with one heck of a view.

### 11 OVERLAND CORNER HOTEL

A mere 600 feet from where the steamers used to dock, the Overland is so much more than just another pub on the passage from Sydney to Adelaide! It's a living museum with a unique history and fantastic beer selection.

### 12 WAIKERIE

### WAIKERIE.COM

Affectionately known as the town where the sun shines year round, it's the perfect place to sample the local fruit and incredible reginal produce. With its name derived from the local indigenous meaning of 'many wings', the area fittingly showcases a variety of rare birds which you can spot whilst visiting Waikerie Water and Nature Park or on the Waikerie Cliff Top Walk. Make sure you take a few snaps of the Waikerie Silo Art and grab lunch at the Waikerie Hotel.

### 13 RIVERGUM CRUISES

Take a charter aboard this 30-foot cruiser up to 11 people for an impressive range of distinctive Murray River destinations and short or day cruise options. Perfect for those travelling by car that want a leisurely and peaceful afternoon out on the water.

### CAUDO VINEYARD CELLAR DOOR

Producing opulent easy-drinking wines originating on the fertile lands off the Murray. Sit out in the sun and enjoy a glass or two, or maybe even try a refreshing Sangria accompanied by a slice of wood fired pizza. Access to the site is available straight off the houseboat!

### 15 BIG BEND BY NIGHT

Offering visitors the chance to see large numbers of kangaroos and the elusive wombat in the wild on unique spotlighting tours at Big Bend on the banks of the Murray River. Enjoy a bush tucker breakfast or a riverbank dinner watching the sunset changing and reflecting the colours of the sandstone cliffs. If travelling as a group, the Sunnydale Shearing Show is worth seeing, as is the milky way that dominates our accredited Dark Sky sanctuary.

### CAPTAIN COOK CRUISES - PS MURRAY PRINCESS

Discover the splendour of the Murray River with Captain Cook Cruises 3, 4 or 7-night cruise adventures onboard the charming paddle wheeler. Bookings are essential for all cruises.

### 17 PS MARION

For those looking for a shorter experience, the PS Marion offers an exceptionally traditional and authentic experience. Built in 1897, it's one of the last heritage steam driven paddle steamers and the only dry dock of her kind left in the world. This is your chance to see history on the water!

#### 18 MONARTO SAFARI PARK




